EXHIBITORS SCHEDULE

SECTION ONE : FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

The judge will look for uniformity, size, free from blemishes, colour, firmness and ripeness

1a: Apples: Four apples of the same variety on a plate (with stalks intact)

1b: Plums: Four plums of the same variety on a plate

1c: The longest runner bean

1d: One Pumpkin

1e: A basket of mixed vegetables (at least 3 different types)

1f: Three beetroot on a plate

1g: Four tomatoes on a plate - any variety other than cherry.

1h: One Marrow

1i: Onions: Three onions of any variety on a plate (with stalks intact)

1j: A wonky vegetable

1k: Any four fruit in a bowl

1l: Open to all. An alternative vegetable / fruit sculpture, themes is **Under the Sea**. To be made only from vegetables, fruit and cocktail sticks.



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SECTION TWO: FLOWERS

2a: One Rose specimen bloom, any colour

2b: Vase of autumn flowers

2c: Vase of foliage - 5 stems (5 different types)

2d: Any indoor potted plant

2e: Vase of herbs

2f: Vase of three decorative / cacti dahlias

2g: Vase of 5 sweet peas

2h: Three hydrangea heads of the same variety

2i: A cactus or succulent



SECTION THREE : FLOWER ARRANGING

Exhibit space allocated width 75cm, height 90cm, depth 75cm. one entry per person per class

3a: A basket of autumn flowers & foliage - allocated space width 60cms, height 45cms, depth 75cms

3b: An autumnal wreath - no bigger than 46cms diameter when completed

3c: A design inspired by a country

Novice Class for beginners

3d: A flower display to incorporate a re-cycled or re-used article



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SECTION FOUR : SCARECROWS

Open to groups, schools, families or individuals. A life size scarecrow.

Be creative with your materials. The scarecrow should be self-supporting for display.

4a: A fairy tale character



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SECTION FIVE : CRAFT WORK

5a: A handmade knitted or crocheted item

5b: Something new from something old (max size 60 x 60 x 60cm)

5c: A handmade cushion cover, any material, knitted or stitched

5d: A tapestry or needle worked article (can include beadwork)

5e: An article in wood, any method (including driftwood sculpture)

5f: A patchwork or quilted article

5g: A hand decorated picture frame, no larger than A4



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SECTION SIX : ARTWORK

Your painting should be no bigger than 52 x 42cm including mount and/or frame

6a: Painting: any medium - subject of your choice

6b: Drawing or illustration in pencil, pen or ink - subject of your choice



SECTION SEVEN : PHOTOGRAPHY

Photographs should be mounted on card for display and no bigger than 21 x 29cm

7a: Penwortham Open Gardens

7b: Light and Dark

7c: Reflections

7d: Summer Day



SECTION EIGHT : BAKING

Judged on taste and presentation

8a: A loaf of bread, any variety

8b: A Victoria Sponge

8c: A fruit pie, any variety

8d: Four fruit scones

8e: Glazed Plum Cake - using the following recipe:



Ingredients:

- 200gms (8ozs) softened butter, plus extra for greasing
- 8 red or purple plums
- 140gms (5½ozs) golden caster sugar, plus 1 extra tbsp
- 3 eggs, lightly beaten
- grated zest 1 large lemon
- 175gms (7ozs) self-raising flour
- 6 tbsp milk
- 85gms (3½ozs) blanched almond, chopped (the pieces should be quite big)
- 6 heaped tbsp redcurrant or plum jelly
- 2 tbsp cassis (blackcurrant liqueur) or port

Method:

1. Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Butter a 23cm (9") springform tin, line base with greaseproof paper and butter the paper. Halve stone and slice the plums.
2. Beat butter and sugar (minus the extra tbsp) until pale. Add eggs, then lemon zest and mix thoroughly. Fold in flour and stir in milk. Stir in almonds and spoon into the tin.
3. Lay the plum slices on top of the batter, overlapping them in circles. Sprinkle with the extra sugar and bake for 55 mins - 1 hr. Let it cool in the tin for 15 mins.
4. Remove cake from tin and stand on a rack. In a small pan, melt the redcurrant jelly with cassis/port and 2 tbsp water. Cook until reduced to a syrupy glaze, about 5 mins.
5. Brush the melted jelly all over the cake. It will seem like a lot, but a thick glaze looks good. Leave to set before serving

Ages up to 8 years

10d: A painting – Under the Sea

10e: A decorated wooden spoon – an animal

10f: A miniature garden, no bigger than 40cm by 25cm in a seed tray

10g: A decorated gingerbread man

Ages 8 up to 13 years

10h: A drawing, painting or collage with the theme of My Favourite Day Out (no bigger than A3 and mounted on card not much bigger than the finished painting.)

10i: A decorated rock or stone

10j: A miniature garden, no bigger than 40cm by 25cm in a seed tray

10k: A vegetable sculpture

10l: Three decorated homemade cupcakes

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PRIZE GIVING

Trophy for special achievement, judges choice in the following sections

- 1) Scarecrows, photography, artwork and craftwork - judges' choice based on creativity, effort and presentation
- 2) Flower arranging, flowers and fruit and vegetables - judges' choice based on creativity, effort and presentation
- 3) Preserves and chutneys and baking - judges' choice based on taste, flavour and presentation
- 4) Children's Classes up to 8 years - judges' choice based on creativity, effort and presentation
- 5) Children's Classes 8 up to 13 years - judges' choice based on creativity, effort and presentation

Judges will award first, second and third rosettes in each category of the section.

Best in Show

An overall 'Best in Show' trophy will be presented. To be eligible for this award the exhibit must be awarded a 'first'.

Exhibit may be penalised for being too large or too small for the space allowed.

Predominance of plant material, over all other components in the exhibit.

All plant material must be unblemished, well-conditioned and appropriate.

Clear interpretation of the class title.

Harmony of all components.

Good use of design principles and of space allocated.

Good use of colour, workmanship and distinction.
